


I HEARD THE BELLS

The Christmas season doesn't always bring excitement and joy to all people. Often times, the Christmas season, and simply the holiday season, brings a sense of sorrow, grief, and loneliness rather than joy and cheer for some people.

It is the sorrow, grief, and despair that sits at the heart of one of my favorite Christmas carols, "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day."



Originally titled, "Christmas Bells," Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote this poem in 1863 from a heart and mind jaded by tragedy and remorse. This poem was inspired by several painful events in Longfellow's life that brought about more sorrow and grief than the joy of the season.

For one, his son Charles joined the Union army against Henry's wishes without telling him before he left. Eventually, Charles was severely wounded in battle. Around the same time, Longfellow's wife, Frances, tragically died from an accidental fire, which left Henry badly burned as well.

The third verse, which says,

"And in despair, I bowed my head:
'There is no peace on earth,' I said,
'For hate is strong and mocks the song
of peace on earth, good will to men,'"

shows the depth of despair Longfellow experienced.

So, having an injured son and a dead wife, Longfellow wrote his poem "Christmas Bells" on Christmas Day telling of the despair in his heart as he heard the Christmas bells play.

Fortunately, this poem ends on an encouraging note.



The fourth verse reads,

"Then pealed the bells more loud and deep:
"God is not dead, nor doth He sleep.
The wrong shall fail, the right prevail,
with peace on earth, good will to men."

This verse emphasizes hope and peace among men, despite the troubles of the world. It shows the faith and hope in God that Longfellow had in the face of despair.

Isn't this one of the things that we need to be reminded of this season?

Maybe your Christmas season is one that is riddled with sorrow because of the death and absence of a loved one. Maybe you are experiencing loneliness because you have to be away from family and friends this year. Maybe you are in despair as you've been given a bad doctor's report, or your family situation has dramatically changed.

Whatever your reason for not experiencing the joy of the season, be reminded that our Lord knows what you are experiencing.

He is the Great High Priest who can and will sympathize with our weaknesses (**Hebrews 4:15**). He is the God of all comfort (**2 Corinthians 1:3-5**).

He is the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6).

He is the source of all hope (Psalm 39:7).

He gives the peace that passes all understanding (**Philippians 4:7**).

In His presence is fullness of joy (Psalm 16:11).


